MAYOR ERIC JACKSON TO HOLD TOWN HALL MEETINGS

TRENTON, New Jersey – Mayor Eric Jackson announced today that he will conduct four town hall meetings for residents to share their concerns, suggestions and comments as he continues to transition Trenton municipal government to the Jackson administration.

“I am committed to organizing a municipal government that is efficient, effective, transparent and focused on meeting the needs of Trentonians,” said Mayor Jackson. “To achieve these goals, it is essential that I connect with my neighbors to hear their ideas on how my administration can work with them to build a better city.”

Eric Jackson was elected mayor on June 10, 2014. He took office on July 1st and is currently appointing his cabinet, building relationships with lawmakers, connecting with city residents and engaging stakeholders in business, education, government and faith-based communities.

On July 17, Mayor Jackson introduced his cabinet to members of the City Council at its regular meeting, where he talked about working together to tackle Trenton’s most pressing challenges: public safety; economic development, including business attraction, retention and workforce development; strengthening the Trenton public school district, among other policy goals.

“In order to capture the resources that our city must have to prosper, we will all need to collaborate on creating and executing sound policy,” added Mayor Jackson. “Partnership and teamwork will guide the performance of my administration.”
