





Community Concerns

Complaint received:

I. City wide complaints of ATV and Dirt Bikes riding recklessly throughout the South/East Districts and parks causing quality of life issues/concerns.



Attended to/Stats - Other:

CIB ATV/Dirt Bike Task Force led to the arrests of 4 individuals, 4 towed/seized ATV/Dirt Bikes, 30 summonses issued and 1 gun recovered. *(SEE SLIDE #8)*

II. City wide complaints and reports of male juvenile(s) committing crimes, such as robberies and assaults, throughout the city while riding mopeds.



After months long investigation, CIB detectives identified, charged & arrested a male juvenile for a hosts of armed robberies. NOTABLE ASSIGNMENT: *(SEE SLIDE #9)*

Criminal Investigation Bureau – ATV/Dirt Bike Task Force


Under the direct supervision of **Detective Captain Nathan Bolognini** and **Detective Lieutenant Luis F. Nazario Jr.**, the ATV/Dirt Bike Task Force was deployed into action during the month of October, and was spearheaded by **Detective Sergeant Nicholas Mahan**. Through a combined effort with detectives from the **CIB Task Force**, **Criminal Intelligence Support Unit** and **Hamilton Police Department**, the following statistics were gathered;

Notable Assignment



Multiple Armed and Strong Arm Robberies

During the months of July, August and September 2025, detectives from the Trenton Police Department Criminal Investigation Bureau investigated a string of strong -arm and armed robberies, occurring within the City of Trenton. During each robbery, the suspect(s) were described as being juvenile black males, operating a black moped.

Detective Alan Reasoner of the Criminal Intelligence Support Unit was assigned as the primary detective for these investigations. Following weeks of laborious investigation, Detective Reasoner obtained surveillance footage of each incident, pored through each video, established the identity of a juvenile suspect, and obtained other items of evidentiary value.

During the course of this investigation, the juvenile was observed entering a vehicle after fleeing from police on the moped. The vehicle was stopped and a search warrant was executed. CIB Detectives located several black face masks as well as clothing that was worn by the suspect during each of the robberies.

On Wednesday, October 22, 2025, the juvenile was taken into custody at his residence without further incident and charged with 3 counts of Armed Robbery (with a handgun), 6 counts of Robbery (strong-arm), and 3 counts each of Unlawful Possession of a Weapon and Possession of a Weapon for Unlawful Purpose.



Notable Assignment II

The Trenton Police Department's Criminal Investigation Bureau (CIB), Criminal Intelligence Support Unit, and Property Crimes Unit have successfully dismantled a large-scale catalytic converter theft operation responsible for dozens of thefts throughout New Jersey.

Between February and July 2025, Trenton detectives investigated a surge in catalytic converter thefts across the city and eventually tracked the same group of suspects operating statewide.

Detective Alan Reasoner advanced the case by executing several cellular data warrants, identifying two phone numbers connected to suspects Ledwin Luciano-Perez and Paulo Perez-Vasquez.

Based on the extensive multi-agency investigation, Detective Reasoner filed thirty-four (34) counts of third-degree theft against both suspects in connection with catalytic converter thefts throughout the City of Trenton.


The City of Trenton has back to back holidays every year where there is no trash collection.

We encourage our residents to please keep this in mind and plan accordingly by not placing your trash at curbside until your next scheduled pick-up date. This is very important because putting trash out too early or when there is no trash collection only makes the community unappealing, and it attracts unwanted rodents.

SNOW PREPARATION PLAN



The Department of Public Works's main priority during the snow season is the safety of our residents.

We urge our residents to register with our Code Red Notification (Robocall) System, so that they are advised when vehicles must be removed from marked snow emergency routes. It will advise residents where to park their vehicles when the roadways are being plowed. Registering for this service is also beneficial in keeping residents informed of delayed openings or building closure due to in climate weather.

The Department of Public Works is ready to tackle anything that Mother Nature brings us as it relates to snow and ice.

Our department is equipped with the following:

- * 2 Front End Loaders
- * 7 Dump Trucks

- * 14 Pickup Trucks
- * 9 Garbage Trucks
- * 15 Snow Blowers
- * Over 50 Essential Personnel Members
- * Over 3,000 tons of Treated Rock Salt

- 1) *Organize Our Resources*
- 2) *Prioritize Our Roadways*
- 3) *Utilize Equipment*

- 5) *Review Our Operational Timeline*
- 6) *Review Progress and Results*


SNOW PREPARATION PLAN

- We also would like to remind residents that there are **NO PARKING SAVESIES**. Any object left in the street to reserve a parking spot will be removed.
