Dear Residents,

While the potential for flooding may be stressful and frustrating, I would like to personally reassure you that the Police Department will be doing everything we can to assist you during this time. Below is a list of the things that the Police Department will be doing while stationed in your neighborhood, contact numbers, and information we want to share with you:

1. Police officers will be on foot and in vehicles going door to door to notify residents of the evacuation process.
2. Officers will be stationary at several locations. The Command Post will be located at Mount Vernon and Clearfield, which will be the designated entrance. Police Officers will also be located at Lee and Rt. 29, which will be the designated exit. It should be noted that all entrances, exits, and all streets will be heavily monitored by stationary and roving patrols.
3. As done in the past, house keys may be left with officers at any of these locations, and they will be tagged with your information. You may utilize the tag you receive as a “pass” to enter and leave the area as well.
4. The power grid in this area will be turned off at 8:00 a.m., and all residents are STRONGLY urged to evacuate by that time.
5. Joyce Kilmer School will be available for shelter and have a police presence.
6. All residents are reminded to remove all vehicles from the area as well.
7. All residents are STRONGLY urged to take their pets with them, and if they have an issue with boarding, to reach out to the Trenton Animal Shelter for assistance.
8. There will be someone manning the Command Post 24/7. The phone number to contact the command post is (609) 712-4831. This is a non-emergency line.
9. A daily briefing will be given by myself at Engine 9 every morning at 9:30 am throughout the duration of the incident.

Please feel free to reach out to myself or my command staff at any time if an issue arises that you would like to be addressed. Thank you again for your cooperation during these stressful times.
